

## Floating University Berlin




From May to September 2018 raumlaborberlin will create a visionary inner city offshore laboratory for collective, experimental learning. With numerous partners we will experiment with knowledge transfers and the formation of transdisciplinary networks to challenge routines and habits of urban practices – Floating University Berlin.

The site is an almost forgotten place in the center of Berlin: An old, concrete rainwater basin right next to the Tempelhof airfield. A third landscape on the verge of disappearance. Here we will build a generic structure, a drilling platform for a scarce urban resource: sensitivity for

decision-making.

Students and scientists from more than twenty international universities will come together with artists from all over the world, local experts, architects, musicians, and dancers. Together, they will research and investigate the daily routines and practices of urban living and formulate visions and ideas for a better future city In the territory around the rainwater basin Floating University is looking for contemporary, resilient forms of urban practice with a visionary focus on an unknown future.



Inspired by the Artist Placement Group's strategies of artistic insertions into existing (institutional) frameworks, Making Futures plugs into the Floating University by contributing to its public programming with a series of workshops that operate as collective acts, dedicated to enquire, learn and test future modes of architectural and urban action.

future development of spatial practices by exploring topics such as spaces of coexistence; the right to play, affective tactics, practices of assembly and co-production of knowledge about the city, for our city.




**Arquitectura Expandida: Collective and Affective Tactics**




Can we design methodologies to collectively organise and activate common spaces? consensus or to deliberately incorporate love as a structuring condition of a project.

Departing from an unfinished repertoire and always under construction, this workshop proposes to explore tactics that focuses on relationships - affective, conflictive, historical, symbolic, collaborative or normative-between different actors within a territory.

For instance, the quest for a specific common purpose, to instigate verbal and non-verbal dialogues through spatial actions, to voluntarily dismantle dynamics fixated on achieving



Arquitectura Expandida (AXP) is a design collective based in Bogota, Colombia - a citizen-led laboratory that builds structures -physical, social and cultural- that invite communities to self-organise and take responsibility towards their own territory. AXP allies itself with local community leaders and organisations, but avoids a central role, providing only the design and construction expertise for the execution of the projects. The collective's design philosophy also relies heavily on an embrace of sustainable, affordable and reclaimed materials.

Tor Lindstrand: The Playground Society




This is a workshop about how the battle for children's right to the city, and their right to play, was transformed into everyone's obligation to play along.




Takk: Spaces of Coexistence




How can architecture mediate spaces of relationship and negotiation not only between us -humans- but also with machines and other living beings?

Can we define new notions of beauty through the articulation of the difference and by assembling a multiplicity of materials from different origins and conditions, paying attention both to their physical properties and to their symbolic associations?

In this workshop participants are invited to design and build a small intervention by unraveling all forms of life around the Floating University and exploring the notion of coexistence - of species, materials, relationships.



TAKK (Mireia Luzárraga + Alejandro Muiño) is a space for architectural production focused in the development of experimental and speculative material practices in the intersection between nature and culture in the contemporary framework, with a special attention on the overcoming of anthropocentrism on its different ways (political, ecological, cultural, on gender...). Additionally to their professional practice, they teach at Universidad de Alicante (UA), the Instituto Europeo di Design in Madrid (IED Madrid), and the Institute of Advanced Architecture of Catalonia in Barcelona (IAAC).





Sofia Dona: Renovictions





Broken water pipes, blocked toilettes, removed roofs, permanent facade scaffolds and renting flats to noise bands, are some of the ways property owners follow. How to resist the tricks?



Knowledge today is increasingly produced and distributed through a capitalist logic. The workshop will investigate open source mechanisms to emancipate city inhabitants from data mining resources into becoming co-producers of knowledge about their city, for their city.

Through investigative walks, situated narratives and action design, we will explore the Floating University's surrounding neighbourhood, looking into ways for collecting, co-producing, representing

and sharing different kinds of situated, tacit or contextual knowledge. From this standpoint, we will ask: what library-like format could accommodate such content?



Simeția 2011. were never realized, leaving the area in a state of suspense (it was called at the time 'The Barren Land of City Hall'), a vacant land best suited to temporary buildings and uses such as popular fairs, exhibitions, circus's or seasonal events.

### PLAZA & CIVIC CENTER

Opposite the University, on both sides of the boulevard, two squares emerged. The one on the EW boulevard was completed late in 1935. Located next to the University's main façade, it inherited some spatial intentions from the Academy and Forum Traian (another ghost project never built), and ended up as a space aligned more with the boulevard than as a plaza in front of the University. Another intervention on the NS boulevard which was

communist cities, was the new National Theater and the Intercontinental Hotel. Completed in 1973, this ended almost a century of uncertainty towards this site. The generous space between them was treated as a decorative lawn, with no public use. In 1984-85, using an accidental fire in the building as a pretext for renovation, Ceausescu, who didn't like the shape of the Theater, decided to wrap and extend the building with a new layer of grand arches. The saga continues today and in 2011

### GOING UNDE

Starting in 1975 the underground metro network spreads under the city, of the main stops being University with four exits linking the four corners a wide central underground passage. The pedestrian crossings were eliminated

### NEW SQUARES

After 2010 a series of refurbishment projects occurred across the square. In the SE corner in what had been a rather barren triangle, the Coltea Park was established and used for small concerts. The SW corner 'At The Statues' was transformed from a crowded parking and city pasture, into a mineral pedestrian plaza used for fairs and concerts, following a controversial architectural competition. The NW corner 'At The Fountain' and parts of the NE corner 'At The
